Brainstorm sessions: 13/14 April

These two days of the course will consist of brainstorming sessions on the young researchers' own projects. At present it is not completely certain how many researchers will be attending the Training School, since the budget has recently enabled us to extend the invitations to some of our reserve list. Assuming an attendance of about 30, it should be feasible to run 4 sessions of 3 or 4 projects on each of the two days, with a greater number presented on the 13th.

Presentations should each take 15-20 minutes (maximum 20 slides), with 10-15 minutes' discussion. Researchers should be candid about the progress made and problems encountered in presentations. The discussion involving the whole group is intended to contribute ideas and advice.
